Details of seminar on tackling Vietnam's societal issues through business innovation, August 25, 2022, Hanoi

1. Background

✓ The Mitsubishi Research Institute, Inc. (MRI) opened its Hanoi Representative Office in
December 2020 and has been proposing policies to the local government in order to resolve
societal issues that are emerging in Vietnam in the areas of healthcare, environment and energy,
and transportation infrastructure, as well as supporting Japanese companies setting up their
businesses in Vietnam.

- ✓ The "high quality growth" that Vietnam advocates in Communist Party Resolution No. 50, enacted in 2019, will simultaneously resolve societal issues and achieve economic growth, and could be an opportunity for Japanese companies to make great use of past experience.
- ✓ MRI recently held a seminar With the Foreign Investment Agency (FIA) inviting participants from the Vietnamese government and Japanese companies in Vietnam in fields such as healthcare, environmental, and energy. MRI has identified these fields for focus to introduce ideas and proposals on resolving societal issues in Vietnam.

The seminar was held at the Sofitel Legend Metropole Hanoi and was attended by a total of over 60 participants, including leaders from the FIA, the Ministry of Health, the Ministry of Labour, War Invalids and Social Affairs, officials from local government, and representatives from Japanese companies operating in Vietnam.

<Seminar Contents>

After the opening address by Kenji Yabuta, President of MRI, Nguyen Anh Tuan, Deputy Director General of FIA, on behalf of the guests, expressed his high expectations for MRI's business development in Vietnam.

In the seminar, Ryosuke Ogata, General Manager of Hanoi Representative Office of MRI, explained the outlook for business opportunities in Vietnam, and Ayato Susaki, General Manager of MRI's Future Co-creation Division, then introduced the Initiative for Co-Creating the Future operated by MRI, and its potential for development in Vietnam.

In addition, consultants specializing in the fields of healthcare, carbon neutrality, and "quality investment" in Vietnam explained the status of societal issues in Vietnam, as well as recommendations and business opportunities for resolving them.
